The « Commission Provinciale du Luxembourg » and « Club Sauvétage Bastogne » are pleased to invite you to the LUX CUP 2026.

Our competition will take place at the « Centre Sportif de Bastogne » in a 25m swimming pool, rue Gustave Delperdange 1, 6600 Bastogne, on **SATURDAY 28 FEBRUARY AND SUNDAY 1 MARCH 2026**.

You will find attached the registration form to be returned by **16th Febuary 2026 to the following e-mail address : ben.marloye@gmail.com**. Please fill in the date of birth and the best performances (to 1/100th) of each participant in order to facilitate the formation of the heats. The electronic timing system will be used. The first 120 entrants will be able to take part in the competition.

For Belgian clubs, the Lenex file is compulsory.

For non-Belgian clubs unable to register using a Lenex file, the Excel file can be returned.

Entries of **€6.00 per participant per day** must be paid into the **IBAN account: BE87 1430 9442 8894** by **19 February 2026**.

Please indicate the name of the club and the number of entries per day.

**Entries will not be registered until payment has been received.**

**Withdrawals will not be refunded or deducted.**

### Categories :

- Individuals :
  - « Benjamins/benjamines » : Swimmers borned in 2014-2016
  - « Minimes » : Swimmers borned in 2012-2013
  - « Cadets/cadettes » : Swimmers borned in 2010-2011
  - Juniors : Swimmers borned in 2008-2009
  - Open : Swimmers borned in 1997-2007
  - Masters 30 : Swimmers borned in 1987-1996
  - Masters 40 : Swimmers borned in 1972-1986
  - Masters 55 : Swimmers borned in 1957-1971
  - Masters 70 : Swimmers borned until 1956
  - Description of ES1 event: 25m manikin carry: Start in the water with the manikin for your category, 25m manikin carry. The rules are the same as for the first swimmer in the 4x25m manikin relay.
  - Individuals events for « Benjamins » and « minimes »
    - A1: 100m obstacle swim : same obstacle as for other categories
    - A2: 50m Manikin Carry with Fins : 25m swim wearing fins and then dives to recover a submerged yellow manikin to the surface and carry it to the finish edge of the pool
    - A3: 50m Rescue Medley : 25m swim, turn, dive and swim underwater (10m) to a submerged yellow manikin. return to the surface with the manikin and carry to the finishing line.
    - A4: 50m Manikin Carry : same like other categories but with a yellow manikin.
    - A5: 50m Manikin Tow with Fins : 25m swim with fins and rescue tube, after touching the turning edge, the competitor fixes the rescue tube around a floating orange manikin at the surface and tows it to the finish.
    - A6: 100m superlifesaver : 25m swim, dive to a submerged yellow manikin, 25m carry manikin, dons fins and rescue tube, 25m swim, fixes the rescue tube around a floating orange manikin and tows it to touch the finish edge of the pool.
    - Relays will be run with the small yellow manikin.
    - Mixed Pool Lifesaver Relay : 50m swim, 50m swim with fins, 25m manikin carry and 25m manikin carry with fins.
- Relays events : separated by gender (excepte for the B5) and according to the following categories :
  - Youth : only for « Benjamins » and « Minimes »
  - Open : all categories
  - Masters : only for Masters
  - Teams Relays descriptions :
    - Minimum 4 swimmers and maximum 5 swimmers for B1-B2-B3-B4. Girls/Ladies can swim in the Boys/Men category and Youth/Masters can swim in the Open category.
    - 4 swimmers for the B5 relay (2 women and 2 men)
- SERC : 4 swimmers and can be mixed. **The team may consist of swimmers from different clubs. Please email me their names (and their origin clubs). The maximum number of teams allowed is 10.**
  - Youth : « cadets » and juniors only
  - Open : all categories « cadets » -> masters

## Victory ceremony :

The victory ceremony will be on Sunday at the end of the competition. The first three swimmers/teams will receive a medal by categories :

- Individuals : overall ranking with individuals events (A1-A2-A3-A4-A5-A6) by categories. The rankings are based firstly on the number of events contested. **Event ES1 is not part of the classification and will not be ranked.**
- Relays :
  - Overall ranking with relays events (B1-B2-B3-B4) by categories. **Please note that points awarded for the Line Throw (B4) are described below.** The rankings are based firstly on the number of events contested.
  - B5 : ranking by categories
- SERC : ranking by categories

## Points for line throw (B4)

Each relay team of 4 or 5 people have to enter 2 pairs in the line throw. These 2 pairs will complete the classic line throw relay event. The final time for the relay team ranking will be the sum of the 2 pairs of the relay team.

If one of the 2 pairs is DNS/DQ, the relay team will receive 0 points.

A time of 46"00 is awarded in the event of DNF (the pair doesn't complete the event in 45"00).

Notice 4 swimmers' names in the lxf file and send by mail pairs' compositions and times.

## Organisation :

The rules used will be the Belgian rules. **Epoxy, fibreglass and carbon fins are not permitted in the Benjamins and Minimes categories.**

To facilitate the organisation of the championship, we ask each **Belgian club** to provide the number of officials stipulated in the rules (from 1 participant = 1 official; from 10 participants = 2 officials; from 20 participants = 3 officials). A meal will be served to the officials selected for the jury.
